2011. As ICP opens the 2012 calendar, we wrap up celebrating 2011 with ICP's 70th birthday on December 15 and begin mapping fresh beginnings. At age 70, ICP's core value for inclusion and global wellness took a giant step into the future by opening full membership to colleagues from allied discipline. ICP, Inc. is beginning a new era of inclusion, Nexalism. This word, coined to describe a structured, deliberate interdisciplinary science, represents an advance into conscilience, where multiple sources of knowledge are brought to bear on understanding our world and ourselves: reality's nature and workings, issues and needs, productive and the destructive dynamics. For nexalism and conscilience to be successful it will take patient collaboration and solidarity in shared values.

BOARD NOMINATIONS. Along with year end gifts of dues and special contributions to ICP, please take time to think about ICP's talented members. Send your suggestions for Treasurer, for four Directors at Large, for a Student Representative, and for an Early Career Representative.

All members are eligible to be nominated. Consider nominating a member who is from an allied discipline background. Graduate Students who are members can be nominated for the Student Representative Board position. The Board also now has a voting spot for an Early Career Representative. Since the Presidential term is currently set at two years, that office will not be on the ballot until 2013. The Membership Chair and World Area Chair Coordinator are included as voting members of the Board of Directors. Both incumbents complete their second terms in another year. Elected and appointed leaders, other than the Presidential positions, can serve two consecutive three year terms. leaders to see who is currently in office.

ICP strives for a broad composition that assures a broad international voice. Please consider for nomination member-colleagues from Asia, South America, Africa, and Europe. Nominations from North America are welcome, however, since last year three of the four Directors at Large elected are from the United States of America, committee review will be focused on candidates from other areas.

The 2011-12 Nominations and Elections Committee: Chair: Past President Ann Marie O'Roark; Nominating Committee Members: Past Presidents Chok Hiew, Dennis Trent, and Natividad Dayan. Elections: Ms. Nancy Quatrano, a non member, will receive and report votes as she has in previous years to guarantee anonymity and confidentiality. A ballot will be distributed in the Spring of 2012.



PsychEXTRA. President Lowenstein asked me to explore possibilities of including conference materials, abstracts, newsletters, and annual reports in PsychEXTRA, a research database produced by the American Psychological Association, complementary resource to PsychINFO. The PsychEX-TRA publication is geared to be a resource for information and data on "cutting edge research and practice in the behavioral and social sciences, and [to be] used in academic, medical, and government institutions worldwide." (correspondence from Jill Bleamers, Aug. 29, 2011). Participation in PsychEX-TRA is free. A three year renewable contract is under consideration. Referred to as a "grey" zone publication, it incorporates publications issued by government agencies, universities, private research institutes, psychology labs, scientific societies, professional associations, and other vetted organizations. Inclusion in PsychEXTRA should make conference presenters work more visible to the research community and more easily citable. BOARD SECRETARY REPORT

Donna Goetz



President Ann Marie O'Roark presided over the Outgoing Board Meeting. She announced that Florence Denmark, former ICP President, had been selected to receive the highest award given by the American Psychological Association, the APA Award for Outstanding Lifetime

Contributions to Psychology. The award was presented at APA's annual conference held in Washington, D. C. after the ICP conference. Florence's family and many of the ICP members were there at the award ceremony to congratulate Florence.

Julia Rose, Membership Chair, reported that 47 new members were recruited to ICP during the past year. She sent ICP membership applications to universities and clinics in the UK. Tara Pir, President-Elect, paid for 30 new memberships for new members from California. President –Elect Ludwig Lowenstein mailed letters to psychological organizations worldwide and advertised in the *Psychologist*, the British Psychological Society's publication. Ludwig appealed to all members to increase recruiting so that ICP can remain strong.

After ten years of leadership, Dietrich Albert resigned as chair of the Early Career Award Committee and nominated Cecilia Cheng, a current member to lead the committee. Gerald Gamache, Treasurer, reported on cost-cutting measures that he has undertaken and introduced Assistant Treasurer, Scott Fraser who made additional recommendations.

The Board agreed that increasing memberships and keeping the cost of conventions as low as possible so that more people can attend are goals for ICP.

Ludwig Lowenstein presided over the Incoming Board Meeting. He praised the work of Ann Marie O'Roark, the outgoing president and presented her with two gifts from the Board to thank her for all her

inspiring encouragement on behalf of ICP.

In 2010, the board decided to hold the 2012 convention in Cape Town, South Africa in conjunction with the International Congress of Psychology. Tara Pir said that it would be too expensive for most members to attend both conventions in Cape Town along with the cost of air travel. Since the 2011 convention had low attendance, the board decided to look for an alternate site for 2012 convention.

Ana Guil offered to host the convention at her institution, the University of Seville. A. Guil suggested that holding the meeting in September would lower the costs as the university dormitories would be available. Dates were tentatively set for September 12-16, 2012. With little time to prepare, A. Guil made a Power Point presentation showing some of the facilities in Seville. Robert Morgan, Director at Large, offered to submit a bid to the Singapore Tourist Board to host the convention there in 2013.

Donna Goetz, Secretary, and Julia Rose and Joy Rice, Liaison Chair, offered to assist Tara Pir the scientific program for the 2012 meeting. Anna Laura Comunian is editing the proceedings from the 2010 annual convention in Chicago.

L. Lowenstein asked the board members to take a leadership role in recruiting new members and in making donations to ICP. Tara Pir requested that each board member contribute \$100-1000 depending on their means.

The theme for the ICP 70th Annual Meeting is "Seventy Years of Working towards Health, Peace, and Social Justice." There are two tracks for presentations: (1) Women and (2) Immigration. We hope to see many of you in Seville, Spain in September 2012.

MESSAGE FROM THE TREASURER

25 November 2011 Dear Colleagues,

As we in the United States celebrated Thanksgiving Day yesterday I hope all of you paused to give special thanks to our President Ludwig and our fine Board of Directors. The second call for dues was delivered by e-mail earlier this week and the mail copy for those not having e-mail addresses will be sent out shortly. I encourage each of you to respond to the call for dues as I have to prepare the 2012 budget in January. In order to do so I need a firm figure of revenues. As of today, 13% of our members have paid their 2012 dues. This is about half of the dues paid last year at this time. President Ludwig's message on recruitment should call all of us to action.

Since our annual convention in Washington, D.C. several fantastic events have occurred which should be of great

rejoicing among the membership. First, Dr. Machiko Fukuhara has donated \$10,000 (USD) for an annual award which will be further discussed by the finance committee.

In addition, I opened a Bank of America interest bearing Money Market account to deposit our savings and this generous gift. An interest bearing Money Market account means we still have access to our funds, as opposed to the CD, and the interest rate (.025) is comparable to the CD rates.

Finally, all bills from the D.C. conference are paid and my report to the Executive Board has been made. Our revenue for the 69th convention was \$18,782.63 and our expenses were \$18,535.24 which gave us a profit of \$247.38. However, to accomplish this required over \$7,000 of donated funds and goods/services. ICP is being sustained through the generosity of a few individuals and this simply cannot go on forever.

The Fukuhara Advanced International Psychology Research and Service Award

AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN INTERNATIOAL RESEARCH AND SERVICE. This award is given to a midcareer or senior level psychologist with distinguished contributions to international psychology in research and service and is funded through an ICP, Inc. Award Fund established by Dr. Machiko Fukuhara, past Treasurer of ICP, Inc., Organizer of the 1990 ICP conference in Tokyo, research collaborator with past president Charles D. Spielberger on State-Trait Measures of Anxiety, Anger, Curiosity, and Depression. Dr. Fukuhara served two terms on the Board of the International Association of Applied Psychology and is Director of the Japanese Association of Microcounseling, Director of Psychoeducation Institute, and Honorary Professor of Tokiwa University. Dr. Fukuhara epitomizes the standards of excellence that ICP, Inc. and this Advanced International Psychology Research and Service Award seek to perpetuate.

The award is accompanied by a \$300 check, a certificate, conference registration for participation and presentation at the annual conference, and the next year's dues for ICP membership.

AWARD MANAGEMENT. The Fukuhara Award for Excellence in International Research and Service is managed through the ICP, Inc. Finance Committee and a Committee of five members appointed by the President to oversee the procedures of selecting and presenting the award.

<u>The Finance committee</u> manages the investment of the Fukuhara Fund to assure sufficient monies are available in the operations account to cover all expenses of the award. A report is submitted to the President and Board annually.

<u>The Fukuhara Award Committee</u> publishes the call for candidates, who may be nominated by members and by self nomination in the fall and winter before the annual conference. The committee manages all aspects of communications, selection and presentation of the award and assures a time in the scientific program for the recipient's presentation. All committee members review nominees to determine the recipient on the basis of a five criteria, each criterion weighted 1-5 with 5 the maximum:

- 1. A resume that reports reviewed [juried] publications
- 2. Participation in international conferences and programs
- 3. Unique and outstanding research with international implications / applications
- 4. Leadership in international associations and organizations
- 5. Evidence of being an exemplar of ICP, Inc. values and professional ethics

CELEBRATING 70 YEARS OF WORKING TOWARDS HEALTH, PEACE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

Women & Immigration

The next International Council of Psychologists' Annual Meeting will be celebrated in the University of *Sevilla* (Spain), from 10 to 14 September in 2012.

Situated on the shores of river Guadalquivir, its capital *-Sevilla-* has the fame of being one of the most beautiful cities in Spain, with approximately 700.000 habitants. Its climate is very pleasant in the spring and autumn; and beer, wine and *tapas* (appetizer) are of reasonable prize, variety and exquisite.

Sevilla is located in the South of Europe, near Africa. You can arrive by plane (0:50h from Madrid) or by train "Ave" (2:30h from Madrid).

Its University, founded in 1551 is the oldest in Europe and in actuality one of the biggest in size and excellence in Spain, with 70.000 students and over 4.000 teachers and investigators.

Its more emblematic building -the rectory- is located in the Old Tobacco Factory, where it assumes that the mythical Carmen worked (the protagonist of the novel of Prosper Mérimée, which used Georges Bizet in its famous Opera).



Psychology studies started at the University of Sevilla 36 years ago. Today, its teaching personnel are divided into four departments: Personality, Evaluation and Psychological Treatments; Developmental and Educational Psychology and Experimental Psychology; and Social Psychology.

And it also bestows the Grade of Psychology, seven different Masters: Educational Psychology; Health Psychology; Social Intervention and Community Psychology; International Migrations, Health and Wellbeing: Models and Strategies of Interventions; Organizational and Work Psychology; Advanced Studies in Brain and Behaviour; and Family Mediation Intervention.



Area Chairs are appointed for the purpose of promoting the goals of ICP in a specified geographical area. Area Chairs accept responsibility for assist-

ing in the development of ICP activated and policies in a specific country, a group of countries, or regions within a country, with the overall objective of advancing psychology and the application of its scientific findings around the world. We at ICP have the following requirements of area chairs: (adapted from bylaws and administrative procedures)

Recommending to the Convention Scientific Program Chair specific participants, topics, and/or new research material from their region.

Being a Personal Contacts Facilitator for visiting ICP members from other countries and assisting members from their country to make contacts with members in the countries they will be visiting.

Suggesting and proposing regional meetings as possible that are near to convention sites

Submitting pictures and articles about psychologists from their region for use in the IP or on the web.

Publicising ICP activities and conventions in professional and academic newsletters, websites, or other media.

Contacting members in their area twice a year for updates in contact information, conveying conference information, soliciting new members, and gathering questions or suggestions to send on to the RACC and WACC.

Members not responsive to the 3rd dues request are contacted by the Membership Chair and/or Area Chair, or the World Area Chair coordinator.

1. New Memberships and Changes in Membership Status

Area Chairs are ex-officio members of the ICP Membership Committee. They work to promote ICP membership among psychologists in their respective areas and advise the Chair of the Membership Committee on facts related to their respective countries, and the meaning, for example, of various diplomas, licences, degrees or certification commonly used in particular countries. Membership Chair Dr Julia Rose has worked very vigorously this year to develop and facilitate new members, even to the small but important idea of designing a membership card.

2. Membership Maintenance

An Area Chair is informed when a member from his or her area is about to be dropped for non-payment of dues. The Area Chair takes steps to reawaken the member's interest in ICP and renew the members' awareness of the values of membership.

3. Publicity

Area Chairs work to publicise the purposes and activated of ICP, by working through national, state or regional psychological associations and their periodicals, and through personal contacts with psychological colleagues in university, community and employment settings. At conferences of such associations, ICP publications may be displayed and membership information distributed by the Area Chair. The Area Chair may suggest symposia on topics of international interest, which could be presented with ICP co operation.

4. Newsletter Correspondence

Area Chairs communicate with the Editor of ICP's newsletter, the *International Psychologist (IP)* (currently Dr. Ann Marie O'Roark and Nancy Quatrano) The Area Chairs who have reported are significant in the field of psychology in their areas; forward news of ICP members, their publications, honours, organisations, meetings and other matters of interest; Suggest the types of content that ICP members in their area would like to see in the *IP*, and provide copy for such listings and articles, and/or suggest appropriate courses or methods for conveying such information or material.

Psychology in Malta is increasingly assuming an important role in Maltese society. Over the past year we have witnessed the continued popularization of psychology. Increasing numbers of clients are seeking the help of psychologists in different specializations. MESSAGE FROM THE TREASURER—Gifts to 501(c) 3 organizations

Subj: Gifts to 501(c)3

Background: ICP operates as a IRS designated 501 (c)3 tax exempt organization which means ICP does not pay federal income on revenue earned. Such designation allows dues or registration at ICP conventions to be tax deductible for the membership. However, ICP has no guidelines for accepting contributions or donations.

IRS Guidelines: The IRS guidelines are contained in the 2010 Individual Tax Return Form 1040 Instructions, paragraph 615, lines 16-19.

"The following are deductible as charitable contributions in money or property (but not the value of your time or services) to domestic organizations operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes or the prevention of cruelty to children or animals; domestic fraternal organizations if the gifts are to be used exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, etc., purposes; veterans' posts and organization; federal, state, or local governments if the gift is made exclusively for public purposes; qualified private organizations engaged in fostering natural beauty; or nonprofit cemetery and burial companies.

For the taxpayer seeking deductions:

Unreimbursed expenses incurred in performing services for a charitable or governmental organization may also be deductible. This includes the cost of special uniforms, auto, travel expenses, and other actual expenses in doing volunteer work for a qualified organization. A taxpayer who uses his auto in performing services for a charity can deduct either his actual out-of-pocket expenses for oil, gas, etc., or a flat 14 cents a mile. Add parking and tolls to the amount you claim under either method. But do not deduct and amount that were repaid to the taxpayer.

Travel expenses, such as for transportation, meals, and lodging, incurred when a taxpayer is away from home performing services for a charitable organization are deductible, provided that there is no significant ele-

ment of personal pleasure, recreation, or vacation in the travel. However, the fact that the taxpayer enjoys the service to the charitable organization, such as where a troop leader takes a youth group on a camping trip, will not cause the deduction to be denied."

Discussion: ICP should adapt a policy regarding gifts or donation.

Suggestion: ICP, when approached by a contributor contemplating a gift or donation, should request a specific purpose for that gift or donation, which could be either a gift or donation to the general fund or a specific project. When accepted, a letter acknowledging the gift or donation shall be written by the President, or at the Presidents' discretion, the Treasurer.
