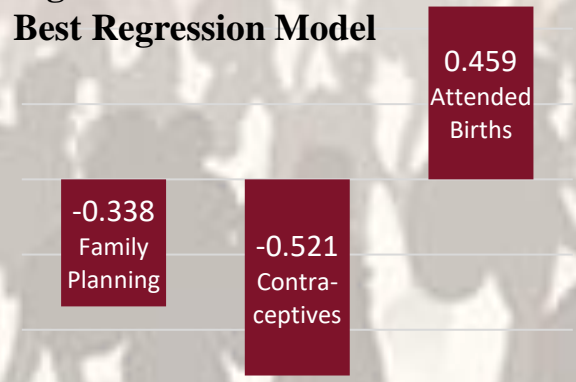
Barriers to Care
